We have received Supplement No. 2 of the Report of the Department of Marine and Fisheries. It contains a quantity of statistical information that will be of considerable interest. We make a few extracts:-

The total value of the production of fish in Canada in 1881 is \$1,817,162.64, an increase of \$1,311,122.96 over the previous year, except in the case of the Atlantic coast, where the value of the catch in 1881 was valued at \$2,214,781.29, about three millions more than the value of the catch in any of the other Provinces.
