FIRST DAY.

First Race—For a Purse of \$400, open to all horses that have never trotted better than 3 minutes: \$20 to first horse, \$100 to second, \$50 to third.

SECOND RACE—For a Purse of \$500, open to all horses that have never trotted better than 2.35; \$325 to first horse, \$125 to second, \$50 to third.

First Race—For a Purse of \$550, open to all horses that have never trotted better than 2.40; \$590 to first horse, \$100 to second, \$50 to third.

Second Race—For a Purse of \$1.00, open to all Trotting horses; \$600 to first herse, \$250 to second, \$100 to third.

FIRST RACE—Flat Race for all ages, mile heats: 2 years old to earry 75 hs., 3 years old 35 hs., 4 years old 18 lbs., 5 years old 114 lbs., 6 years old and upwards, 118 lbs.; 3 lbs. allowed to mares and geldings. Purse, \$500. \$600 to winner. \$100 to second horse.

Sconn Rack—Joen Hurdle Rago, 2 miles, over 8 hurdles, 3 ft. 6 in.; welter weights. Purse, \$900. \$200 to winner, \$100 to second.

Third Rack—Flat Race, for horses regularly used as hacks, one and a half miles, centlemen riders. Weights, 154 lbs. Purse, \$150. \$100 to hrst horse, \$500 to second.

## FOURTH DAY.

First Race—Flat Race, for all ages, weight for age; mile heats, best 3 in 5. Mares and Geldings allowed 2 lbs. Purse, \$490. \$200 to winner, \$100 to second horse.

SECOND RAGE—Hurdle Race, for all ages, weight for age; 3 miles, over 12 hurdles 3 ft. 6 in. Mares and Geldings allowed 3 lbs. Purse, \$400. \$200 to first horse, \$160 to second.

Thurn Race—Consolation Handlean Sweepstakes, \$10 P.P., \$150 added. For horses beaten during the meeting. One and a half miles. Discreent. of stakes to second horse.

GENERAL REMARKS.

The Grand Trunk and Vermont Central Railroad Companies, and the Canadian Navigation Company, will issue tickets to attend the Meeting and return for fare one way, and carry horses the return trip free.

Races to commence each day at 2 p. m.

Trotting to be mile heats, best 3 in 5 to harness, and to be governed by the rules of the American National Trotting Association.


