AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF TURKEY FOR CO-OPERATION IN THE PEACEFUL USES OF NUCLEAR ENERGY

The Government of Canada (hereinafter referred to as Canada) and the Government of the Republic of Turkey (hereinafter referred to as Turkey), and both hereinafter referred to as the Parties:

DESIRING to strengthen the friendly relations that exist between the Parties;

RECOGNIZING the advantages of effective co-operation in the peaceful uses of nuclear energy;

RECOGNIZING that Canada and Turkey are both non-nuclear-weapon States party to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (hereinafter referred to as the "NPT") and as such, have undertaken not to manufacture or otherwise acquire nuclear weapons or other nuclear explosive devices and that both parties have concluded agreements with the International Atomic Energy Agency for the Application of Safeguards in connection with the NPT;

UNDERLINING further that the parties to the NPT have undertaken to facilitate, and have the right to participate in, the fullest possible exchange of equipment, materials and scientific and technological information for the peaceful uses of nuclear energy and that parties to the NPT in a position to do so may also cooperate in contributing together to the further development of the applications of nuclear energy for peaceful purposes;

INTENDING, therefore, to co-operate with one another to these ends;

HAVE AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE I

- (1) The co-operation contemplated under this Agreement relates to the use, development and application of nuclear energy for peaceful purposes and may include, but is not limited to:
 - (a) the supply of information, which includes technology, including but not limited to:
 - (i) research and development,
