



- (e) recognition of the following elements of sustainable development: common security; ecological; social and economic well-being.
2. Canada should review all Canadian policies and international agreements for their contribution to human and ecological security and sustainability.
 3. Canada should review all international agreements which relate to or impact on sustainability to ensure accountability by Canada.
 4. Canada should clearly identify and define the Canadian values which reflect our commitment to and the necessity for global sustainability.
 5. Canada should state that it recognizes and asserts its responsibility for holding transnational corporations accountable for their impact on sustainable development (e.g. through the UN).
 6. Canada should develop international linkages and networks of influence.
 7. Canada should pursue and coordinate unofficial consultation and collaboration, i.e. Track II process, (ARF, CSCAP, APEC study centres, PECC) which could help develop coherence between and among the global, multilateral, bilateral, regional and community levels.
 8. Canada should increase representation of Indigenous Peoples and Asian-Canadians in DFAIT and international organizations involved in Asia-Pacific.
 9. Canada should promote consultative mechanisms and enhanced collaborative problem solving through the official process i.e. APEC.
 10. Canada should ensure that issues of sustainable development remain on the agenda of further National Forum meetings.
 11. Canada should integrate business and NGO input into relevant APEC fora.
 12. Canada should ensure that terms of reference for publicly-funded feasibility studies in infrastructure projects include components relevant to sustainable development.
 13. Canada should develop a statement on Canadian foreign policy sustainable development values. (note: a CIDA statement is available)
 14. Canada should develop and support strategies to aid in implementation of value structures in relation to issues of sustainable development concomitant with Canada's. For example:
 - (a) industry awards for clean technology exporters;
 - (b) annual review of public and private sector sustainable development activities;
 - (c) partnership between private and public sector capital flows, and NGOs, to support sustainable development.
 15. Canada should ensure that all economic activity is underpinned by the principles and practice of sustainability – both in Canada and in our activities overseas.
 16. Canada should develop incentives to encourage annual reporting on business and environment practices.
