INTERNATIONAL NEGOTIATIONS AND AGREEMENTS

Exchange of notes between Canada and Newfoundland concerning the operation of a commercial air service by Trans-Canada Air Lines, John's, March 13 and 16, 1945.

OFFICIAL STATEMENTS AND RELEASES CONCERNING EXTERNAL RELATIONS

Announcement of the lifting of the ban on trading between Canada and Belgium - press release of March 5, 1945.

Announcement by the Prime Minister that he would be unable to attend the forthcoming meeting in London of representatives of the governments of Commonwealth countries, and that the Associate Under Secretary of State for External Affairs and the High Commissioner for London would represent Canada at the meeting - press release of March 5, 1945.
