for the trial of Election Petitions, pursuant to "The Dominion Controverted Elections Act," a report relating to the Election for the Electoral District of Bow River, and the same was read as follows:—

To the Honourable,

The Speaker of the House of Commons of Canada:

We, the undersigned being the two of His Majesty's Justices of the Supreme Court of Alberta assigned to the trial of the under-mentioned election petition, hereby certify that on the 16th day of January, 1919, we heard the evidence adduced and the arguments of counsel in support of and in opposition to the petition of Jesse Elmer Gouge presented to the said Court praying that it might be determined and declared that the respondent Howard Hadden Halliday had not been nominated as a candidate at the election of a member to represent the Electoral District of Bow River in the House of Commons of Canada held on the 17th day of December, 1917, and that all votes given or purporting to have been given for the respondent at the said election were and are null and void, and that the respondent was not duly elected or returned and that the petitioner, Jesse Gouge, was duly elected at the said election.

We further certify that, at the close of the said hearing, we reserved our judgment upon the same and that, on the 1st day of February, 1919, we gave our unanimous decision dismissing the said petition with costs against the Petitioner, and from

the said judgment no appeal has been taken.

We append hereto a copy of the notes of the evidence taken upon the hearing of the said petition.
