The following answers, deposited with the Clerk of the house, are printed in the official report of debates pursuant to standing order 39:

CANADA ATLAS

Question No. 96—Mr. Racine:

1. What has been the preparation and printing cost of the Canada atlas?
2. How many such volumes have been printed (a) in English? (b) in French?
3. How many such volumes have been sold (a) in English? (b) in French?

Answer by: Hon. Noel Dorion (Secretary of State):

1. The cost of printing and materials excluding labour and Queen's printer costs amounted to \$71,500. Precise costs, particularly of the preparation, would be impossible to assess as it would include meetings of inter-departmental committees and the various other committees which were held from time to time to consider planning of the atlas and would also include research done by this and several contributing departments. No one was ever employed exclusively for any length of time on Atlas of Canada work and it would be impossible to determine how much of the work was done along with other duties.
