JRP/HBT Dear Colonel Bovey, I am glad to have your letter of 15th instant. I take it that for Session 1925-1926 we are now squared in respect of the payments. We paid Mr. McOdrum £300 in all, and the £57:7:5 received from you, squares off Gower's £300. Mr. Law is going out under the same terms, namely £250 as Scholarship plus £50 travelling expenses, and as in the case of Gower we have advanced to Law, £50 to meet his travelling expenses, repayment of which I shall be glad to have from you in due course. I think I told you that I had managed to get Gower into a private sanatorium near Edinburgh. From what I can learn of his case, he seems to be in a pretty bad state. To meet the hospital expenses my Committee have voted him a sum of £30, which I am to use at my discretion. I sent him £10 a few days ago and got with the receipt a letter from Gower's mother which seems to indicate a condition, not altogether hopeless, but very serious. I had Law medically examined by one of the Medical Officers under the National Committee, and have got a certificate attesting his sound health.
