umklâmmern, v. a. insep. w., to cling to, embrace; past part. and adj., -t, see note to l. 130.

umringen, v. a. insep. w., to surround [not conn. with the strong v. **ringen**, "to wring," but der. from **Ring**].

ûntreiben, v. a. sep., **trieb**, **getrieben**, to drive around, cause to move in a circle.

unendlich, adj., no compar., endless, never-ending.

ûngeheuer, subst. n., gen.-s, pl. —, monster.

ûngestalt, subst. f., pl.-en, monstrosity, monstrous shape.

verhählen, v. a. insep. w., to hide, conceal (dat. of pers. from

whom the thing is hidden). [The old strong part. **verhohlen** appears in the adv. **unverhohlen**, "without concealment."]

verkündigen, v. a. insep. w., to announce, proclaim.

vernéhmen, v. a. insep., **vernahm**, **vernommen**, **vernimm**, **vernimmst**, to perceive, hear.

verwündert, adj. and adv., astonished, surprised; in astonishment or surprise.

wagen, v. a. w., to dare, venture.

Wahn, subst. m., gen.-(e)s, no pl., illusion; frenzy, madness.

wallen, v. n. (**haben** [and **sein**] w. [to walk, make a pilgrimage];), to wave, heave. [In the former sense it takes **haben** when *action* only is expressed, **sein** when *direction* also is meant.]

Wâsserhôle, subst. f. comp., pl.-n, watery grave or abyss (lit. "water-cavern").

Wâsserschlund, subst. m. comp., gen.-(e)s, pl.-schlünde, watery gorge or abyss.

wégwerfen, v. a. sep., **warf**, **geworfen**, **wirf**, **wirfst**, to throw away, cast away, fling away.

[**weilen**, v. n. (**haben**) w., to wait, tarry.]

Weilen, subst. n., inf. of prec., gen.-s, no pl., waiting, tarrying, expectation.

Welle, subst. f., pl.-n, wave, billow.

wiederkehren, v. n. (**sein**) sep. w., to return, come back.
