Leafs Again Lose to Bisons Battle Bitterly 10 Innings

Buffalo Fans Rooting for Toronto to Beat Out Rochester—Tim Jordan Starts Off With Home Run.

BUFFALO, Sept. 5.—(Special.)—In one of the most bitterly fought games, verbally and physically, played on the local grounds this season, Buffalo put a kick in Toronto's chances for the championship by winning today's ten inning game by a score of 7 to 6. Seldom, if ever, was there so much wrangling between players, umpires and spectators as was heard in this afternoon's battle. Umpire Murray was the goat of the spectators on account of his poor rulings in the Montreal series and on every occasion today the players on both teams took exception to his decisions, which must be admitted were anything but favorable to the visitors.

The game today was also probably one of the most sensational, the fans have had the pleasure of watching a score time and again, and the excitement on both sides and clever fielding generally, time and again brought the crowd to its feet. When it is taken into consideration that the local fans are queuing up for the Maple Leafs to beat Rochester out for the pennant, they naturally want them to win all the games, and to an unbiased spectator it would appear that the game was being played in Toronto, from the ovation the visitors received every time they pulled off something.

Home Run Jordan. Hardly had the game started before Tim Jordan started the spectacular stuff by smothering the ball over the right field fence. Dalton flew out to Murray's deep centre, and O'Hara walked. He was later caught by the first baseman, singled to left, and with two out it looked bright for Beane.
