### CHINA NOW CLAIMS A GROSS BREACH OF FAITH

Russia Holds Much Appropriated Proce ty Which Has Been Given to Jap Traders.

MUKDEN, May 14.—The repeated promises made by the Japanese the past three years to return to China the property appropriated thru the exigencies of war are still unfulfilled. In consequence of this China is experiencing much indignation at what is conang much indignation at what is considered a gross breach of faith.

As yet the necovery of a large amount of government and private property in numerous places unrucut Manchuria, which was appropriated by Japan without compensation, on the sole pretext that China had falled to sole pretext that China had failed to observe neutrality in allowing Russia to occupy these properties, is considered doubtful. This excuse is not considered homest, since Japan is fully aware of China's helplessness to enforce neutrality, while Japan, in regard to the abuse of the neutrality, is considered equally guilty. Russia holds much appropriated property which has much appropriated property, which has been given to Japanese traders with-out any compensation to China.

#### WORKINGMEN'S HOMES. Business Men's Association Will Build 1000 in Toronto.

The Cottage Home Association, Limited, an organization which will be composed altogether of Toronto business men, will make a serious effort during the coming summer to solve the question of properly housing the working population of the city. Steps are now being taken to secure the charter of incorporation. It is the purpose of the association to put up in the next four years 1000 of these homes, each of which will be nominally valued at \$1800, but will be sold for \$1400, on the basis of an initial cash payment of \$100, and the payment of \$16 a month for about 12 years. Until the payments are completed, the association will pay all taxes, local improvement rates and fire insurance, and will also take out sickness, accident and death policies on the lives of the purchasers of the houses, and will

pay the premiums on them.

The promoters of the project propose to build from 200 to 250 houses during the summer in various parts of the city. The plans have already been prepared, and call for six-roomed houses, built of brick veneer, and having furnaces and bathrooms.
