NEWMARKET, Eng., Oct. 26 .- The NEWMARKET, Eng., Oct. 26.—The police here to-day arrested a man suspected of having designs on the life of King Edward or the Prince of Wales The prisoner, who was a meemoer of the Bechauanet and (South Africa) police, names J. H. Pearse, was found wandering in Chippenham Park, where the King had been shooting this week, and in which the prince is going to shoot on Monday. Pearse, when taken into custody, said he intended to "shoot the boss who was shooting here. After a preliminary examination in the police court he was remanded for further enquiries regarding his past life. Pearse, participated in the Jameson raid in the Transvaal, and is laboring under the impression that he has a grievance against King Edward with such wisdom and public spirit. 
