## WHEAT VERY IRREGULAR.

## Bearish Element Had a Day of Ascendancy in Chicago.

## Decrease in Visible Supply—Grain on Passage to the United Kingdom—English Market—Lard and Cheese Lower—Canadian Cheese in Britain—Gossip.

Monday Evening, March 7.

Wheat is 6d lower in Liverpool.

Wheat to-day advanced slightly in New York, but cash wheat fell 2c and May 1c in Chicago, futures closed from 4d to 4d higher in London than on Saturday.

## STOCKS TAKE A TUMBLE.

## New York and London Markets Suffer From a Semi Panic

## Superinduced by Fresh Rumors of War Over Cuba and of Russia's Aggressive Attitude in the Far East—Prices Fall Quickly, But Partially Recover Before the Close.

Monday Evening, March 7.

The Cuban war scare was an important factor in to-day's markets on both sides of the Atlantic. American railway stocks first slumped heavily in London, and the New York market followed suit.

Among the warlike announcements of the early portion of the day were those regarding the securing of an option on two Japanese cruisers now building in Japan, and the introduction of a resolution in Congress purporting to authorize the President to declare war on Russia.

The London market was a little better, but the New York market was a semi-panic. Had news from the Far East helped to affect the British markets.

In London American rails at mid-day showed a fall of from 3 to 2 1/2 per cent. from Saturday's closing. C. P. R. went off a couple of points.

In New York sugar took an extreme slump of 5 1/2 cents, while Manhattan, N. Y. C. and other stocks fell in a panic way.

The National City Bank, New York, has \$2,000,000 in gold on the way. Total since Feb. 28, \$8,700,000.

Earnings of K. & T. for fourth week in February show an increase of \$17,201.

Spain's 4's down to 57 1/2 in London.

Increase in earnings of Louisville and Nashville for fourth week in February, \$33,458, or \$18,427 for the month.

Consols are 1/4 lower.

During the latter end of February military stocks suffered severely on the London market. French aggression in West Africa started the slump, and the story that a German movement had started in South Africa was the cause of the panic.

The war scare evidently had some effect on the market. The principal factor, however, was the fall in prices of the London market.
