PRATT BROTHERS BEING TRIED.

Evidence of Doctors of a Technical Nature-A Funny Witness-Case Goes on,

The trial of the three Pratt brothers on a charge of manshaughter dragged along the whole of the day in the Criminal Assizes yesterday, and at 5.30 p.m. was adjourned until to-day.

Dr. J. M. Cotton, who, with Dr. Chariton of Weston, performed the post mortem on the body of John Berryman on June 6, was the first witness called by the Crown Counsel. The doctors in their report said that John Berryman died from general peritoritis, caused by the bursting of an abscess on the right side of the abdomen.

Dr. Cotton, in answer to quest.ons as to what caused the abscess, said it might have resulted from an injury by any force coming the contact with the body. The bursting of the abscess caused the peritorities. The abscess might have formed and burst between May 2 and 22.
