

Boxing and Wrestling Champions University Tournament Finals

Pearson Wins Heavyweight From King, the Latter Also Losing Middleweight to Macdonald—Macdonald Beat Doherty.

The university gymnasium was comfortably filled Saturday on the occasion of the final bouts of the first boxing and wrestling tournament under the auspices of the Varsity Athletic Association. The boxing bouts of the pupils of the Williams school at their best, except that W. H. Macdonald, S.P.S., who defeated Doherty in the final round.

Jim Pearson won the heavyweight from the slender Mr. King. The latter was a favorite with the crowd, having taken the place of H. A. Barnett, who was suffering from a cold. It was King's bout in the third when Pearson put a right to the jaw, solving the defense. King was somewhat groggy thereafter. Pearson looked good thirty rounds heavier than King, but deserves every credit for defeating his skilled opponent.

Macdonald defeated Doherty in the light-weight semi-final. The contest showed clever defense on both sides, being a fine display of high class boxing. The winner had only a slight margin, but sufficient.

Fae won his second contest of the at-

ternoon, defeating King in the middleweight final by a good margin. The winner kept after his man through. King was not recovered from his heavy defeat, and only at the close of the second round did he show his true form.

Macdonald won Doherty down in the final for both welterweight and light-weight classes, ending up in the third round. Summary:
