Important Edicts, Translations of Which Have Just Been Received in America.

On Sept. 27 and Oct. 1 three imperial decrees were published in The Peking Gazette, which, in keeping with numerous edicts of the past two years, unark important steps in China's development.

The first of these is in the name of the dowager empress, and it states that a contitutional government and parliamentary representation are desired ends, and that the calling of an imperial assembly is a first step in that direction. A further step of education and preparation is the establishment of local councils in places to be selected by the vice-roys and governors, and in these a system of "local self-government will be tentatively tried." The ministry of the interior is charged to formulate a scheme for "local self-government for the empire," and the ministry of education is commanded to draw up a plan for "universal education through the empire, and of the books to be studied in the schools thereof."
