THREE REFORM DECREES IN CHINA'S AWAKENING

Important Edicts, Translations of Which Have Just Been Received in America.

To say that China is marching rapidly in the path of civilization, and that the conservatism of the ruling officials has given way to an earnest desire to bring the nation up to the position which she ought to occupy in the ranks of civilized powers is to say what is obvious to all who are in touch with the history of recent events in the far east. On Sept. 27 and Oct. 1 three imperial decrees were published in the Peking Gazette, which, in keeping with numerous edicts of the past two years, mark important steps in China's development.

The first of these is in the name of the dowager empress, and it states that a constitutional government and parliamentary representation are desired ends, and that the calling of an imperial assembly is a step in that direction. A further step of education and preparation is the establishment of local councils in provinces to be selected by the viceroys and governors, and in these systems of "local self-government" the interior is charged to formulate a scheme for "local self-government" for the empire, and the ministry of education is commanded to draw up a plan for "universal education" throughout the empire, and of the books to be studied in the schools thereof.

The second decree is in the name of the emperor himself, and it impresses upon officials and commoners the duty that the country is just faced for a constitutional form of government. The viceroys and governors are ordered to be selected by the viceroys and governors, and in these systems of "local self-government" the interior is charged to formulate a scheme for "local self-government" for the empire, and the ministry of education is commanded to draw up a plan for "universal education" throughout the empire, and of the books to be studied in the schools thereof.

The third decree is also in the name of the emperor. It is doubtless called forth by the recent Boxer uprising at Kanchowfu, where the mission property of the Roman Catholics and of the China Inland Mission was destroyed, whilst in the neighborhood of the city, priest, Cadagila, and a number of nuns were killed. It is the clear and most satisfactory pronouncement yet made upon the relation of missionaries and converts to the government and laws of the country.

The "deep regret of the throne" is expressed, and the blame is laid upon the incapacity of the authorities concerned, for the recent Boxer uprising, put between converts and non-converts.

All are alike children and proper subjects of the emperor, and they are alike amenable to the laws, without distinction of race, color, or creed, charged to prepare a scheme for the treatment of converts and non-converts, and to print and circulate them among their subjects.

Important Changes.
These, in turn, must make a close and diligent study of these abstracts, so that they may be able to act in accordance with the trend of official policy, only with justice and impartiality towards all, without invective and distinctions, and without partiality towards any one class.
