

are scarce, in fact there are none at all, and as to following the Chief over the prairies they state that it is altogether out of the question, as they have been used to live on fish from their childhood. They therefore beg the Department of Indian Affairs to grant them their earnest desire of having their Reserve allotted to them immediately at Strab River to include their houses, farms and little plots of ground which they held before the transfer. They also beg that this matter be decided as soon as possible and similar to the Quorn Bay Indians.

They wish to be attached to this Treaty for payment of their annuities, as they say that they never have been paid at stated times, and that they have had to leave their homes to receive their Treaty money at great inconvenience and expense to themselves.
