SECOND DAY.

Mr. Brydges read report of the Committee of Conference on the Metropolitan question. (See page 661).

Reports were read by the Rural Deans of Hochelaga, Bedford, Iberville and St. Andrews. (See page 653).

Rev. W. Henderson read a report of Committee to the Rural Deanery of Bedford, on the subject of the Ladies' School at Dunham. (See page 657).

Notices of Motion were received from Rev. Canon Bancroft, Rev. Canon Baldwin, Rev. J. Carmichael.

At eleven o'clock the Synod proceeded to ballot for the Executive Committee, the Bishop having named as scrutineers Rev. R. W. Norman, Canon Evans, and Messrs. Pangman and King.

Mr. BRYDGES moved, seconded by Mr. T. WHITE, Jr. That the report of the Executive Committee be adopted.
