serious desire to follow the programme. It is expected of a Trail Ranger that he be truthful, reverent, ambitious, intelligent, loyal, resourceful, active, natural, generous, earnest, reliable and strong.

What "Tuxis" Stands For.

The Tuxis organization gets its odd name by the coinage of the word "Tuxis". It starts with "T" which stands for training. It ends with "S" which stands for service. The "X" in the centre is the Greek letter "Chi," which stands for Christ. The programme thus is Christ-centred. The remaining letters "U" and "I" refer to the other fellow and one's self. The word is, therefore, ingeniously conceived and, though a short one, laden with much meaning.

The Tuxis body is divided in "squares" usually led by a Sunday school teacher as mentor. The Trail Rangers are divided into "camps." As offshoots to these bodies there are boys' councils, parliaments, grand camps, conclaves, etc.

It is doubtless refreshing to thoughtful citizens to find such well organized and energetic work amongst our sturdy youth of the male persuasion and that the Canadian standard efficiency training, which was organized in the Toronto Y. M. C. A. in the early '90s has spread throughout the country and is so well rooted in St. John and other sections of the maritime provinces. It is in reality an outgrowth or development of various experimental plans employed in the larger Canadian cities

between 1900 and 1910, and since that time has been proving its worth as an inspirational force and a moulder of character.

What the Lads Are Taught.

The fourfold programme of C. S. E. T. for Trail Rangers comes under the following four heads: School, woodcraft, collections, observation, handicraft, speaking and reading, beginnings of life, health and strength, camping, team games, group games, swimming, athletics, church worship, church school, mid-week Bible discussion, daily devotions, great Christian leaders, church training. Home helpfulness, help the other fellow, the clear trail, observing vocations, loyalty, heroes of service.

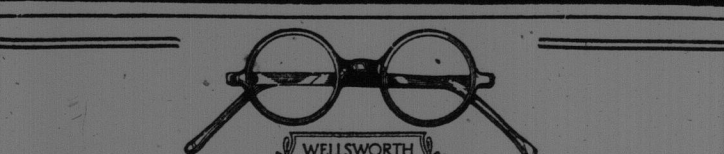
In the Tuxis branch of the C. S. E. T. for older boys the programme includes school and supplementary training, woodcraft, arts, craft and hobbies, public speaking and current events, home reading, trips and lectures, sex education, health education, campcraft, team games, group games, aquatics, athletics, church worship, Sunday school, church relationships, mid-week Bible discussion, morning watch, nature, music and poetry, home relationships, community responsibility, choosing life work, special training, study and makers of Canada, and world service.

St. John Looms Big.

Like the Boy Scout movement, both the Tuxis and Trail Rangers' bodies have an elaborate array of honor badges, crests, and other insignia of progress and success, which obviously serve a very useful purpose. In St. John the various squares and camps have shown much vigor in athletic circles. The square of Central Baptist church played its way from the local championship to the highest basketball honors in the maritime provinces and in a previous year won most points on all counts for the leadership of the continent.

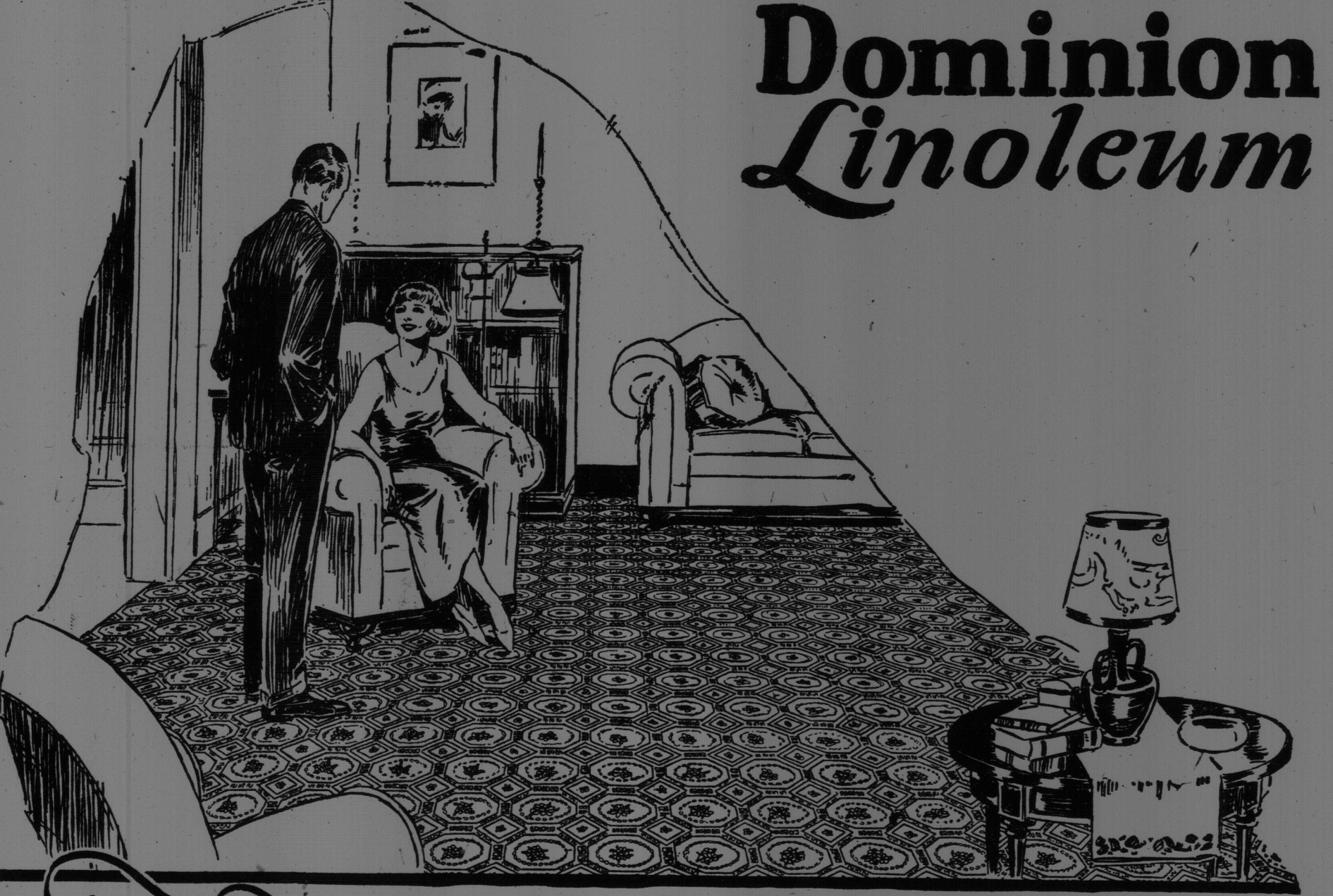

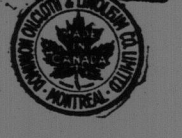

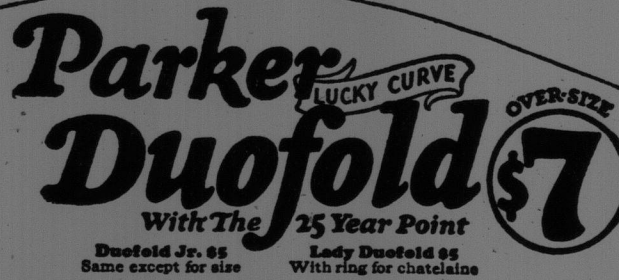
