RADIO STATIONS ARE GREAT HELP

Location Given to 15,374 Vessels
from 29 Stations Last
Year—How the Stations
Operate.

Boston, May 17. — (By Associated Press).—Radio compass stations, maintained by the United States navy at more than 100 places along the Atlantic, Pacific and Great Lakes coasts as aids to mariners in foggy weather, have robbed the sea of many of its victims, say New England seafaring men.

Last year, with but twenty-nine stations in operation, the naval men informed the captains of 15,374 fog-shrouded vessels of their location and thus enabled them to lay their courses to their ports of destination. An average time of four to six minutes was required to make the calculations upon which this information was based.

How a wireless station on shore can tell the master of a vessel lost in the fog just where his vessel is seems something like a miracle to a landsman, but it is simple enough to the operators of the system. It works this way: The radio operator in a compass station on shore picks out of the air the letters "Q. T. E.," flashed from a vessel lying perhaps 100 miles or more off shore. In the International Code these letters mean, "What is my true bearing?" and these queries are coming to the shore station with such increasing frequency as to testify to the dependence which ship masters are placing on this modern aid to navigation.

Once the signal is heard the radio operator adjusts his radio compass to meet the direction where it comes. This compass is merely a rectangular coil of wire mounted on a vertical plane and fixed to turn so as to face in any direction. It acts like a mechanical ear and from it the operator can tell clearly the direction whence the lost vessel's call came. That means that he can tell in what direction the vessel lies from him.

Other stations along the shore also act in the same way, and these report to a central station and connect with the distance of the ship from the shore can be told approximately by the wireless operators by the strength of her signals.

If the ship lies east from one station and south from another, the point where these lines cross is the ship's location. Once this is done the wireless operators on shore have only to tell the ship's master his position in terms of latitude and longitude.

As an illustration of the method by which the directional plan operates to assist vessels, officers in the Naval Communication Service here advanced the case of a steamer south of Cape Sable in the North Atlantic, heading for Boston, which had not had the aid of signals for several days because of storm or fog. Dead reckoning would give the skipper an approximate position for temporary purposes, but through his wireless operator he could send out a call for his bearings from shore.

Within a few minutes, the station at Otter Cliff, Me., would report a true bearing of 125 degrees; Portland, Me., 102 degrees; Appleton, N. H., ninety-two degrees; from which the ships can calculate readily that he was fifty miles north and east of the position that he had erroneously approximated by dead reckoning.

Moving south for several hours, still in a fog, the ship could get another set of bearings for confirmation of its position from a southerly group of stations that more immediately protect the approaches to this port. The angles of their bearings in relation to the vessel would be more acute, and with the possibility of error from the finely drawn lines, an additional long range bearing would be advisable, this being supplied from a northerly station to act as a check.

SUNFLOWERS ARE POPULAR

Proving a Remarkable Success

Edmonton, Alta., May 9.—Asians to secure first-hand information regarding the growing of sunflowers for ensilage purposes, I applied to Mr. Craig, deputy minister of agriculture, for the names of farmers near at hand upon whom I might call in my quest, and by him was referred to George F. Emerson, whose farm is located a short distance from this city.

In the course of a day-long tour of the Edmonton area, therefore, I dropped in at the Emerson home for a few minutes' chat with the man who more than any other has given the sunflower its present place in the estimation of farmers of this vicinity.

In letters written on former trips, I have dealt with the matter of sunflower production in Alberta. I have told particularly of the splendid work of an experimental and practical nature carried on by Professor Hutton in connection with the operation of the demonstration and supply farms of the Canadian Pacific Railway; also in one or two former letters I have quoted from the statements of such experts as Messrs. Bark, Stokess and others.

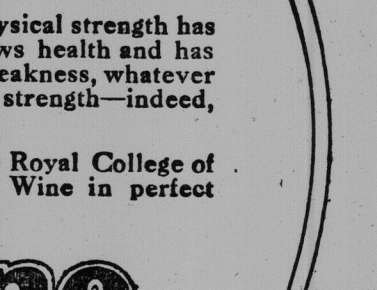

During the winter I give the cattle about forty pounds each per day and the horses twenty pounds," was the reply.

"To the poultry we throw a peckful or so at meal times; just whatever they would pick up at an ordinary feeding."

"Do you sow feed at all?"

"As to that I must say that I am still learning," Mr. Emerson returned. "Last year I sowed at the rate of twelve pounds to the acre; this year I shall cut it to eight pounds. This latter figure, I believe, will prove to be a good average rate of seeding, and the crop should run from twenty tons upward per acre."

The crop last year was cut when in the "dough stage"—immediately following the "milk stage"—and results were such as to lead Mr. Emerson to con-

clude that sunflowers should be harvested at that period in their growth. An ordinary corn harvester was used for cutting, and the chopping and silo-ing was done with the help of an ordinary engine-power outfit.

Good Results From Poddy.

"The results with the poultry really were remarkable," said Mr. Emerson. "We have only a few fowls, thirty-one laying hens, so egg-production means something. I want to tell you that, on several occasions during the winter, the hens made a record of 100 per cent egg production. In one instance the 100 per cent rate was established three times within the week. The fowl seem to be just as keen for sunflower silage as are the horses and cattle, and these will leave any other food for the silage when it is put before them."

Mr. Emerson's fame as a sunflower silage farmer is gone beyond the confines of Canada. He is deluged with correspondence regarding his work in this connection, and on the day of my last visit had received a letter of inquiry from a farm owner living in Brooklyn, New York, who had seen in a newspaper reference to the sunflower farm on the outskirts of Edmonton.
