Prince of Wales Visits His Duchy Of Cornwall

Hearty Greetings For Him to Those as He Toured Through Historic Portion of His Future Kingdom

The Prince of Wales, who will come to St. John next month, has been engaged recently, as Duke of Cornwall, to a visit to his duchy. The visit took him through some of the finest scenery of Devon and Cornwall. He visited towns, farm-houses, mining works, and villages, and experienced a characteristically west of England welcome brimful of plain, honest heartiness.

Newton Abbot was lavishly decorated when the royal visitor, looking the very embodiment of cheery good health, in spite of a long night journey, stepped from his saloon carriage.

The chairman and the members of the district council welcomed him, the chairman presenting an informal hearty address, concluding with a fervent "God bless you," and the whole place rising magnificently to the occasion.

His royal highness replied: "I thank you for the appreciative and kind welcome which Newton Abbot has given to me. I know what splendid work you have done during the war and what your sacrifices have been, and I know also that your king and country are grateful."

It had been intended to leave immediately after the presentation of the address, but the prince found time to inspect soldiers, nurses, demobilized men, ambulance workers, firemen, boys' and girls' organizations and other bodies, to chat with wounded men, shake hands with hundreds of admirers, and finally make a slow tour through the streets headed by a band and accompanied by practically the entire populace.

Part of the journey was made by the prince standing bareheaded in a motor car with the chairman of the council beside him. He was pelted with roses, and received the accurate throw of one pretty girl by placing her flower in his
