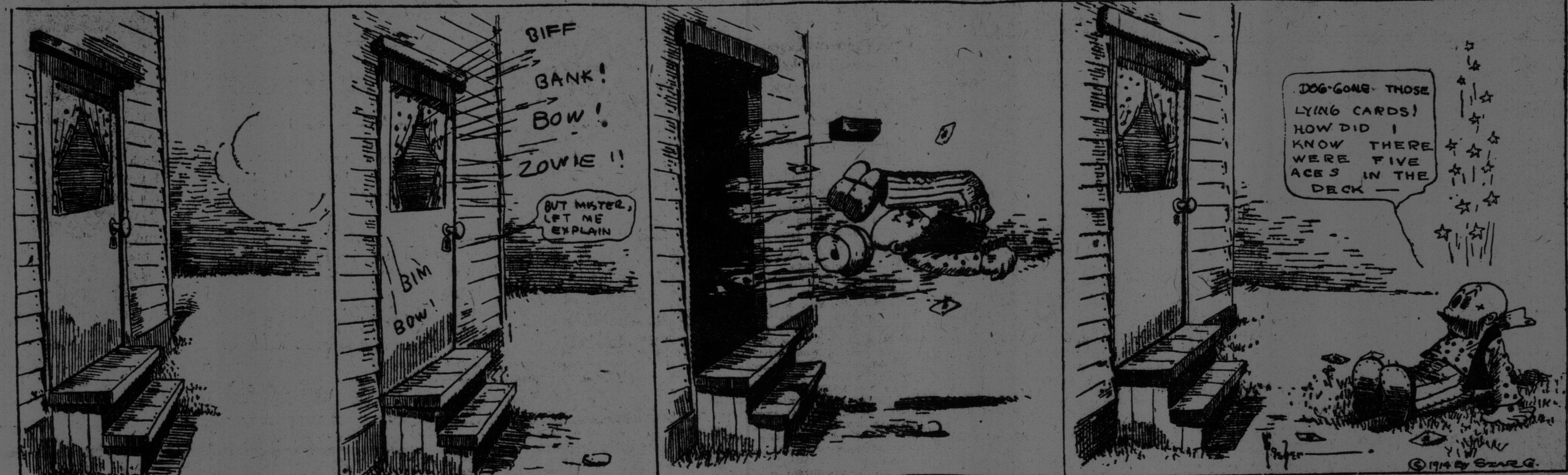

Milwaukee, Wis., March 7.—While the fight fans and boxing critics in the States look upon the match between Georges Carpentier, the French champion, and Kid McCoy, which takes place March 14th in Paris, as somewhat of a joke, the followers of the game in the French capital take it very seriously.

When one stops to consider that McCoy will soon be 41 years of age and started his fighting career in 1891, it does not seem possible that a strong young fellow like Carpentier will have a great deal of trouble winning the battle.

Should McCoy beat the Frenchman it will be the surprise of the 20th century. There is no doubt that McCoy was a wonderful fighter in his day, but the many before him, he has seen his best day and cannot be compared at this time with the French champion.

The chances are that Georges will win and he will be a more popular idol in the eyes of the French boxing fans than ever before.
