Sad news came to the city this morning in a message received by Mrs. Brown, wife of Capt. E. W. Brown, of Metcalf street, telling of the death of her brother, J. W. Fanjoy, a former North End wan, off Prince Edward Island. No particulars were given, except that the body had been recovered. A despatch to the Times, however, is taken to show that Mr. Fanjoy was one of two whose dead bedies were found in a motor boat which drifted ashore yesterday at Guernsey Covenar Charlottetown, and which was supposed to have left New Glasgow the day before, and thought to have been disabled. At an uniquest held upon the bodies of the two men it was the verdict that they had left were Glasgow on Sunday no had her bows somewhat damaged.

Mr. Fanjoy's companion was James Ders (New Glasgow, N. S. The dispatch stated that they had left New Glasgow on Sunday morning for the home of Mr. Dersley's father in P. E. Island and that while crossing in a heavy gale they lost control of the boat. A little dog was found tied in the boat, still alive.


