The outstanding metallic product of Outario are silver, nickel and gold The gross value of these to the end of 1924 follows:—silver, \$224,822,000 nickel. \$197,600,000; and gold \$154,419,000.

Of silver, the production in 192-was 9.561,315 comeas, or over fifty per cent of that from all Canada. The Cobalt silver mines have been it operation for over twenty years, and to the end of 1924, along with out lying areas such as Gowganda and South Lorrain, have yielded over 156 million ounces, worth approximately \$200,000,00. The yield is now at the rate of about, 19,000,000 ounces per year.

Ontario is the only producer of nickel in the Dominion, and supplies ninety per cent of the "world's requirements of this metal. Post-was depress on has passed away, and in 1924 the nickel mining industry functioned on better than a pre-war scale. The nickel deposits of Sudhury yield harze quantities of copper as a byproduct, also important quantities of platinum metals.

Of gold, Ontario's production is 1924 was over eighty per cent of the entire output of Canada and had a raise of \$15,669,562. The increase in output over 1925 encessed 514 million dollars. At the present time the yield is approximately 215 million dollars per month, principally from Porcepins and Kirkind Lake or more than one-half that of the entire United States.

The metal mines of Ontario occur The ractal mines of Ontario occur in the pre-Cambrian formations which cover seventy per cent, of the entre northland. Only the southern fringe of these formations has been penetrated. The development of new mining areas means the expenditure of money for supplies and labour, and the new wealth created is gradually distributed to all classes of the community.
