"Advance" Scientific Miscellany.

It is claimed that more rain falls now in Nebraska than formerly, and that this rainfall is increasing with the march of settlement and consequent cultivation.

The researches of P. Plantamour have shown that every rise in temperature is accompanied by an elevation of the ground, and a fall of the thermometer is marked by a sinking of the ground level, in some cases, quite remarkable.

Fragments of celestial bodies in the form of meteors occasionally reach us from the distant regions of space. These stones exemplify the same chemical and crystalline laws as the rocks of the earth, and have afforded no new element or principle of any kind.

It is that wonderful phenomenon, the aurora borealis, accompanied by sound, about 77 inches, while it is 155 inches in South America. In the Eastern United States, it is 40 to 50 inches; but west of the one-hundredth meridian, beyond the Mississippi to the Sierra Nevada, it is mostly 12 to 16 inches. The average amount in Great Britain averages 35 inches; in France, 20 to 21 inches; further from the coast, in Central Germany and Russia, only 15 to 20 inches; but about the Alps, it is mostly 35 to 50 inches.

By keeping the soil beneath charged with moisture, forest regions tend to the spot where the soil is dry, and give uniformity to the flow; and hence, when forests are cut away, the rains reach speedily to the surface, making them liable to alternate periods of wasteful violence and worthless feebleness. The cutting away of the forests has led, in the French Alps, to uncontrollable floods, despoiled fields, and an impoverished people; and, in America, to annual seasons of dry mill-ponds, an immense sacrifice of available water-power, and the desertion of many a mill-site.
