This move came as a surprise and caught the government off its guard. The speaker set the debate on the motion for the commencement of the night session.

The Mexican forces, under General Torres, numbering about 400, have killed forty Yaquis and taken 167 pri soners in a two days battle in mountains east of this camp.

The Mexican officers refuse to make any statement of their own losses until they make their official report, but private soldiers of the force who took part in the fight say they are incons derable, although there are sick and wounded among the returning troops.
General Torres left garrisons at the small towns and ranches which had been abandoned and expects to return to the same district if the Yaquis con tinue to cause trouble.
