BERLIN, March 26.—The Ost Afrikanische Zeitung publishes a horrible account of the tragic fate which overtook a native at N'geta, German East Africa.

According to the custom of the country one of the native planters had caused his fields to be weeded by friendly natives, paying them no money, but granting them unlimited quantities of pombe, a special kind of beer drunk by negroes of the colony.

One of the negroes, who belonged to the tribe of Waluguru, which regards snake fiesh as an especial delicacy, found a huge beaconstrictor lying in the middle of one of the fields, and, instead of informing the planter on whose ground it lay, confided the discovery to one or two other natives, and arranged with them to kill it during the hours of darkness, so that they might enjoy the delicacy together.
