Meanwhile whatever the course of events, our labor shall not be in vain; and the weight of our principles shall be demonstrated in spite of hostile devices, and by means of them.

We take occasion to commend in the highest terms, the course of our Visitor in relation to the recent political struggle, so bold, patriotic, and christian.
