WALL STREET REOPENS DOORS FOR FIRST TIME SINCE WAR BEGAN

Unusually large attendance on floor of Exchange — Trading light and reflected timidity of Investors and Brokers

New York, Nov. 28.—The New York Stock Exchange re-opened its doors today, for the first time in nearly four months to permit of limited trading in bonds. The conservative element had successfully resisted all efforts to renew business, even in tentative form, until home investment conditions reflected some justification for such action.

It was evident, however, that the resumption of operations, even under the rigid terms imposed, which included the establishing of minimum prices, exercised a marked effect upon sentiment throughout the financial district. There was an unusually large attendance of members and the soundness of the opening tone was echoed by long and prolonged cheering from the trading floor, which was taken up by the visitors in the galleries.

Trading all through the brief session reflected hesitation and timidity on the part of investors and brokers. Dealings at all times were very moderate, this being shown by the total business of the session, which amounted to the insignificant sum of \$644,000 par value, exclusive of \$5,000 in government bonds. The largest single transaction was a sale of \$20,000 Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul General Mortgage 4 1/2 per cent. bonds, which was recorded in the early dealing at a loss of 2 1/2 points.

NET LOSS OF OVER 10 MILLIONS

New York, Nov. 28.—On the past week's currency movement of New York banks with the interior, according to preliminary estimates made yesterday in anticipation of today's bank statement, there was a net loss amounting to about \$10,000,000.

On the direct interior movement a gain of \$8,664,000 was shown; through the Sub-Treasury there was a loss of \$18,845,000. Last week there was an indicated gain of \$688,000, two weeks ago a loss of \$9,188,000. In this week a year ago there was an indicated gain of \$2,485,000, and two years ago an indicated loss of \$7,946,000.

Returns compiled yesterday by banks of this city, through which most of the currency shipments are handled, show the following currency movement for the week ending today: Received from interior institutions, \$11,489,000; shipped direct to interior institutions, \$2,826,000; net receipts, \$8,664,000, against net receipts of \$1,103,000 last week, net receipts of \$7,890,000 in the week ending November 13, and net receipts of \$10,035,000 in the week ending November 6.

Net receipts or shipments for the current week in previous years: In 1913, net receipts, \$4,594,000; in 1912, net receipts, \$6,309,000; in 1911, net receipts, \$3,151,000; in 1910, net receipts, \$1,750,000; in 1909, net receipts, \$8,763,000; in 1908, net receipts, \$1,345,000; in 1907, net receipts, \$977,000.

The Sub-Treasury's returns for the week's transactions with New York banks show net receipts by the Government, on all accounts, of \$28,915,000; net payments by Government to banks of \$7,970,000, and, therefore, excess payments by banks to Government of \$18,945,000, against \$10,415,000 paid by banks to Government last week. Net receipts by Government in this week a year ago, and \$10,197,000 paid by banks to Government two years ago.
