

COLONEL HOUSE FINDS GROWING SIGNS OF NEW UPHEAVAL IN EUROPE

Learns Opinion in Holland is That Germany Has Decided
to Cast Her Lot With the East.

WORLD REVOLT MEANS STARVATION TO HALF THE POPULATION, IS HIS SOLEMN WARNING

Western Powers' Determination to War on Reds Blamed
for Fight of Soviet Russia to Force Bolshevism Upon
Every Nation.

The Hague, Aug. 18.—Colonel E. M. House today made the following statement for the Public Ledger foreign service:

"The police regulations are the most noticeable thing to strangers visiting Holland. They are not unlike those in Russia in days gone by. The cause is Bolshevism. It is not here as yet, but the shadows are lengthening and each day they loom larger.

"Poland is hopelessly enmeshed and Germany is face to face with it. The hour is critical and the next few weeks or months may determine the fate of Europe—of the world.

"It is believed here that Germany has decided to cast her lot with the East. If true, that is a momentous decision and one in which every nation has an interest. Its immediate effect will be to create a new balance of power, and its ultimate effect will be to determine whether the present civilization is to be replaced by that which seems to be now in the making.

Tremendous Upheaval Foreseen.

"It is not that Bolshevism is believed in per se, but it is the momentary available instrument to which the restless, unhappy and discontented turn. Before the world settles down again to its age-long task of producing in order that people may live, there is every indication of an upheaval which may disturb the foundations of our political, social and economical life.

"When an adjustment is finally made it will probably not be in the form which has come to Russia, but in a saner and more moderate form. It is no transition period that is more to be feared than the final outcome. There is a fundamental fact that should be driven home to people everywhere, and that is that revolution seldom stays within reasonable bounds, and if the world, as a whole, should suddenly be brought to some-thing akin to the condition which has prevailed in Russia for the last few years, then half its population would perish from starvation and cold. The machinery by which the life of the present-day mankind is kept going has become complicated and is so delicate that a break here and a break there would throw the entire organization into helpless confusion. That it is easier to tear down than to build up is a truism which the war has brought home to us with terrible force.

Germany's Plans Uncertain.

"While it is not certain that Germany will definitely join Russia in her political experiment, it is certain that the majority of Germans believe that their industrial and economic future lies to the east and the southeast rather than to the west. The economic council is now perhaps the most influential body in Germany. It is said that neither the Reichstag nor the Cabinet makes an important decision without first taking advice from it. Its dominating members control the iron, coal, dye and electrical supplies of the empire and it is through the German organizations that Russia's life will probably some day be ruled.

"This movement for trade control of eastern Europe is viewed with alarm by some continental financiers and with satisfaction by others. One group feels that, in its last analysis, it means that Germany and Russia with their contiguous territory will become linked together and be a menace to the Allied Powers, while another group welcomes any solution which may be a steady influence during those anxious times.

"When our republic was launched we were satisfied to give to our people the government they desired and were content to let the future determine its value. Not so with Russia. For the first time in history we see a great nation using all its resources to impose its social, economic and political views upon other states.

"It is not certain that this was at first contemplated and it is probable that the present extraordinary situation was brought about by the frank avowal of the western powers to try to destroy the kind of government which a large part of the Russian people had decided upon. Retaliation was natural and a sequence to self-preservation. At the inter-locked conference which met at Paris in November and December, 1917, there were those who saw the

danger of such a policy, but the warning was unheeded.

Propaganda Experts Trained.

"In this warfare of ideas we find the East relying almost wholly on propaganda and the West almost wholly upon force. The peculiar nature of the conflict gives the East the advantage and for reasons which need not be considered now. There are said to be schools in Moscow where pupils are instructed in the method and the use of propaganda. In one class there is taught the proper argument to be used in India and the surrounding states. In another there is taught what seems to be the most convincing every symptom of a feeling of injustice throughout the world and in many ways that baffle the Secret Service of the western powers. The effect of the propaganda has been so successful that the Public Ledger in its leading editorial of July 29 gives this timely warning and admirable advice which is only one sure way to kill Bolshevism: 'Propaganda, and that is by leaving no soil on which it can possibly take root. We must in this happy country pay close and sympathetic heed to every symptom of a feeling of injustice among the classes which the Red fanatic always seeks to cultivate. A contented democracy is immune from the microbes of revolution by force.'

ANOTHER RUN ON BOSTON BANK

First State Bank, With Many
Depositors of Foreign Birth,
Pays Out \$100,000.

Boston, Mass., Aug. 18.—Hundreds of depositors of the First State Bank in the North End, chiefly foreigners, participated in a run on that institution tonight, withdrawing about \$100,000 in savings and Christmas Club accounts. The run was an aftermath of the Ponzi expose, and was precipitated by rumors that a bank in that district would soon be closed.

There was no disorder. The bank, a private institution, remained open an hour later than the usual closing time. Its president, Thomas Nuttle, mounted a chair in front of the bank and addressed the crowd while the run was in its height. He said that the bank was ready to pay or receive money.

"Whoever wants his money can have it," he said.
