TWO HUNDRED PRIESTS IN LINE

Republican Flag Covers Casket and Irish Volunteers Much in Evidence.

(Continued from page 1.) When the services at the cathedral ended and the procession formed under the supervision of the Irish volunteers, moved off slowly, the cathedral bell began tolling. This was immediately echoed by the bells of the other churches in the city.

John Peter MacSwiney, brother of the dead Lord Mayor, acted as chief coffin-bearer. Father Dominic, MacSwiney's private chaplain, and Arthur Griffin, vice-president of the Irish Republic, came immediately behind him.

One hundred and eighty priests headed the procession. They were followed by high church dignitaries. Then came two flower-bedecked hearses, a company of volunteers dressed in citizens' clothes, and twenty-five carriages with women mourners.

Volunteers Carry Tributes. Volunteers, each of them carrying floral pieces, formed an outer column on each side of the procession. A cord of volunteers held back the solid lines of bare-headed spectators who overran the sidewalks.

As the clergy were filing away from the graveside after the body had been lowered, six men, who were admitted within the circle formed by the volunteers took position over the grave and fired a volley of three volleys and solemnly withdrew.

Mr. Griffin, in paying a tribute to MacSwiney's life work in the service of the Irish cause, declared that Lord Mayor of Arc would stand in the martyred Lord Mayor a worthy comrade in heaven.

AMERICAN COWS SPLITTING GERMAN REPUBLIC NOW

Berlin Fears Incoming of Alleged "Vast Herds" Will Destroy the Trade at Home

Little did the humanitarian American Dairy Society suspect that when some time ago they offered to the German people as a free gift 2,500 milk cows they hopelessly divided an entire nation.

Great Herds Coming. Pressure was brought to bear upon the Berlin Government and all kinds of pretexts were found to prevent the acceptance of the gift. For many weeks a furious battle has been fought between the socialist organ, "Vorwaerts" and the reactionary agrarian "Deutsche Tageszeitung," the former maintaining that the offer should be accepted at once, while the latter disapproved that American cows are suffering from all kinds of diseases from tuberculosis to Texas fever, which they would inevitably give to all the cows of Germany.

RUSSIAN PEASANT IS REAL MASTER OF THE COUNTRY

He is Hostile to Reds and Their Overthrow Must Come Through His Aid.

By B. F. KOSPOTH. (Copyright, 1920, by Public Ledger.) Moscow, Oct. 27.—Russia's salvation rests with the peasants—this is an axiom on which all experts have long been agreed. No army will ever take Moscow unless it can count on the support of the peasants in the territory throughout which it advances.

Wandering from village to village on both banks of the Dnieper river, between Alexandrovsk and Katerinograd, I made an extended investigation of the political mentality and the economic conditions of the peasants of southern Russia. All this district had been evacuated by the Bolsheviks quite recently after an occupation lasting ten months; in many cases the Reds had left but 24 hours before, and some of the visited villages were still in "No Man's Land," deserted alike by Reds and Whites and left entirely to their own devices.

Peasants Hostile to Reds. As the result of my investigation, I am able to state positively that the peasants of southern Russia are without exception intensely hostile to bolshevism, and its supporters. All villages are armed against the Reds, but this does not yet mean that they are all for General Wrangel. They know nothing of Wrangel; they are ignorant of what he has done in the Crimea; only vague reports of his land reform have reached them and the old fear that the volunteer army is coming to rob and oppress them, is still in the same way as the Red army, still lives in their suspicious, narrow minds.

Enlightenment Very Slow. As soon as the peasants realize that the soldiers of the volunteer army do not plunder and see the partition of the land is really being carried out, their distrust gives place to confidence. But this process of enlightenment is very gradual, and that is why, as General Wrangel himself told me at Melitopol, the advance of the volunteer army northward must be gradual too, for it dare not march faster than the knowledge of the order and liberties it is bringing spread among the country folk.

Doubleless there is something revolting in the primitive optimism of the Russian peasants, in their utter lack of patriotism. In spite of six years of war and civil war they are rich and growing richer all the time. Signs of their wealth are everywhere in this region along the Dnieper, which has been fought over again and again. Well built villages unscathed by fire or sword, barns bursting with grain, herds of two and three hundred head of cattle grazing on the plains—all testify that even the Red commissary does not dare interfere with the omnipotent Russian peasant in his lawful pursuits. Who ever will not establish his right to grab over more land and get ever richer is his enemy. He will not fight on either side in the mortal struggle that is convulsing his country; he lets others do the fighting and waits for the fruits of victory to be poured into his lap.

He is ignorant, obstinate, superstitious; as a farmer he is inefficient, lazy and barbarously distrustful of every instrument or method not used by his fathers before him.

Yet he is today, by virtue of his very selfishness and overwhelming majority, the real master of Russia's fate. Upon his irresponsibility will depend the future of the country and it were again a car come to rule over Russia he will have to be "a peasants' czar."

COOKERY COLUMN

Cocoa Roll. 1 tablespoon butter, 1 cup sugar, 1 cup flour, 3 eggs, 1/2 teaspoon vanilla, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 tablespoon milk, 3 tablespoons Cowan's Cocoa. Method:—Beat eggs until light, add sugar gradually. Add milk, mix and sift flour, baking powder, salt and Cowan's Cocoa. Add to above mixture, mixing thoroughly. Add vanilla and melted butter. REDS LAUNCHING GREAT DRIVE ON BARON WRANGLER

Bolsheviki Cross Dnieper River in Two Places With Troops from Poland.

GENERAL WRANGLER IS OUT-NUMBERED

But Anti-Red Leader Has Shortened His Front to Prepare for Expected Blow.

Schastopol, Crimea, Oct. 31.—Russian Bolsheviki forces have begun a violent offensive to wipe out the armies commanded by General Baron Wrangel, head of the South Russian Government. The Bolsheviki have attacked the Dnieper River opposite Mikopol and branching out from Kharkov.

TRAIN LOADS OF GERMAN SOLDIERS ENTER LITHUANIA

Vast Stocks of War Stores Being Moved Into Territory at Same Time.

Warsaw, Oct. 27.—Thousands of rifles and machine guns with some military artillery, are reported to have been transported from East Prussia into Lithuania recently and train loads of German soldiers are going there, according to information reaching Warsaw from Vilna and elsewhere.

The inter-allied commission is investigating to determine if German troops are in violation of the Versailles treaty by these shipments.

Information from Vilna is to the effect that some of the German soldiers arriving in Lithuania are Gen. Zelinski, in command of the troops occupying Vilna, has been making defensive preparations. Rail communication between Vilna and Warsaw has been interrupted by the destruction of bridges and territorial disputes, has been resumed.

Citizen committees have been organized in Warsaw, Poznan, Cracow, Lemberg, and elsewhere, for the relief of Vilna, where there is a food shortage. Polish towns have been asked to supply food and clothing, and several shipments are on the way.

LETTS QUIT KOVNO BECAUSE OF DEFEAT. Riga, Oct. 31.—The Lithuanian Government is hastily evacuating Kovno and is removing all railway material possible to Shavli, and other points of northern Lithuania, as a result of General Zelinski's insurgent army having broken through the Lithuanian front near the town of Vilander, 45 miles northeast of Kovno Friday evening.

General Zelinski's offensive operations along the whole front and his forces are attempting to surround Kovno and attack it from the rear.
