#### INCOME TAX—EXEMPTION INCREASES IN BUDGETARY PROPOSALS

**Mrs. Grace MacInnis (Vancouver-Kingsway):** Mr. Speaker, I do not know which is worse, the audience or the noise.

On May 14 I drew the attention of the Minister of Finance (Mr. Benson) to the fact that the Economic Council had recently set new poverty levels at \$1,800 a year for single persons and \$3,000 for married couples. My question was:

Will the minister in preparing his new budget consider raising income tax exemption levels from \$1,000 for single persons and \$2,000 for married couples who have survived 21 years of inflation?

You found my question Mr. Speaker, unacceptable but assured me that I had made a suggestion which I must assume would be considered. Perhaps it was, but the fact remains that when the Minister of Finance (Mr. Benson) brought down his new budget two weeks later, on June 3, there was no
