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deposits of iron ore in this County. At Londonderry there are large quantities of it manufactured into iron and shipped; there are also some deposits of coal, the soil is very fertile, both fishing and shipbuilding is carried on.

Cumberland County, capital Amherst. This County is the border County between New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, it lies at the head of the Bay of Fundy on one side, and Northumberland Strait on the other, there are extensive marshes comprising 1,600 acres, the soil is exceedingly fertile, the I. O. R. runs through it, lumbering is carried on extensively, coal is found abundant in some portions, and grindstones have been made and shipped in large quantities, also freestone, lime and gypsum are found; fishing is also carried on extensively.

Digby County, capital Digby. This County was formerly part of Annapolis County, the inhabitants are largely the descendants of the French who first inhabited Nova Scotia, at Bear River there is considerable shipbuilding carried on, part of the County is quite mountainous, the herring fishing is among the chief business of numbers of its inhabitants, its waters abound with other fish, it has a fine bay, which would make the finest harbor in Nova Scotia except Halifax, the Annapolis River empties into it, and it is connected with the Bay of Fundy by what is called Digby Gut.

Guysboro County, capital Guysboro, on the Strait of Canso—which separates the County from Inverness and Richmond. Shipbuilding is carried on, gold is found and considerable mining done, fishing is also carried on to a large extent and has caused a large trade with foreign ports.

Hants County, capital Windsor. The Indians were the first inhabitants of this County, and portions of it in the early settlement of the whites in the country was claimed by them as their hunting grounds, and a reservation was made to them. There are large quantities of land—which is very valuable—reclaimed from the tidewater. The county is well adapted to agriculture, and shipbuilding is carried on extensively.
