Penalty on persons turning out of road to evade toll.

XVI. And be it enacted, That if any person or persons shall after proceeding on the said road with any carriage or animals liable to pay toll, turn out of the said road into any other road, and shall enter the said road beyond any of the gate or gates without paying toll, whereby such payment shall be evaded, such person or persons shall for every offence forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten shillings, to be recovered before any one Justice of the Peace for the said District of Wellington. 5 10

Penalty on persons permitting others to pass through their lands in order to evade toll.

XVII. And be it enacted, That if any person or persons occupying or possessing any enclosed lands near any toll-house or toll-gates, which shall be erected in pursuance of this Act, shall knowingly permit or suffer any person or persons to pass through such lands, or any gate, passage or way thereon, with any carriage, horse, mare or gelding, or other animal liable to the payment of toll, whereby such payment shall be avoided, every person or persons so offending, and also the person riding or driving such animal or animals or carriage whereon such payment is avoided, being thereof convicted, shall for every such offence, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding currency, to be recovered before any one Justice of the Peace for the said District of Wellington. 15 20 25 30

Judges may commit to prison in case of non-payment of fine.

XVIII. And be it enacted, That if any person summarily convicted under this Act, shall not pay the fine or penalty, together with the costs, if awarded, (which costs, the convicting Justice or Justices are hereby authorised to award, if he or they shall think fit,) either immediately after such conviction, or within such time as the said Justice or Justices shall appoint, it shall be lawful for such Justice or Justices to commit the offend- 40
