

## Matheson and Herman Elected

Dalhousie students elected Dave Matheson and Joan Herman to the two highest positions on the campus in yesterday's elections. Matheson defeated Bruce Willis by 286 votes while his running-mate, Joan Herman, also won by a sizeable majority of 229 votes over Nigel Gray.

In other elections Julia Gosling defeated Sandy Clarke by a large majority in the race for the presimajority dency of the Dalhousie Glee and Dramatic Society. Sid Oland was elected vice-president and Phoebe Redpath, secretary.

First year Law student, Stu Mac-Kinnon, defeated Commerce man Smith in the contest for NFCUS chairman.

Murray Dewis was re-elected president of DAAC, defeating Stu Mac-Innis by a majority of 172 votes. Steve Thompson will ocupy the post of DAAC vice-president with Ted Wickwire as secretary - treasurer. Judy Wilson will head DGAC with Janet Sinclair as vice-president. Peggy Baker was earlier elected secretary by acclamation.

Representatives elected to the Council from the various faculties include: from Arts & Science, Senior Girl, Judith Bennett; Senior Boy, Peter Outhit; Junior Girl, Phoebe Redpath; Junior Boy, Wally Turn-bull; Sophomore Representative, Pam Dewis. Commerce elected Martin Farnsworth; Law, Jack Davison; Pharmacy, Dick Wedge and Engin-eering Carl Day. Issac Boniuk and Byron Reid will represent Medicine. George Travis was elected by acclamation from Dentistry.

Marg Sinclair will lead the girls of the campus as Delta Gamma president. Helen Muir defeated Elliot Sutherland by 3 votes for the post of secretary-treasurer of that organization in what appears to have been the closest contest of the elec-




