Dear Mr King:

Immediately upon returning home I got in touch with a number of men of the different shades of politics. Amongst others I saw Mr A.J.McRae, who though not the official head of the U.F.O. is the soul of it in this County. The posters are out for a Convention , of the U.F.O. to be held on the 20th inst. for the advertised purpose of nominating U.F.O. candidates for the Local and Dominion. I find, however, that they have not settled upon any one and are groping in the dark for willing candidates . There are several local aspirants but none of them appear willing to get under the heavy financial burden of a campaign. D'Arcy Scott of Ottawa has been feeling his way for a nomination from the U.F.O. through J.J. Morrison, their Toronto Secretary, but locally it is not taken seriously. He has also approached the local Liberals but I know he got no encouragement from them. He may, however, make a final effort to get a nomination on the 20th. When I interviewed Mr McRae he would of course no commit himself, but I gathered that he saw a way out of the difficulty by nominating a man for the Local only, and passing up the Dominion, and not opposing you if you are a candidate at the By election.
