make a detailed study of the protection issue and he wishes to become well informed for the campaign as it develops.

I have subscribed to the Ottawa Journal and also the Province and Colonist, and have considerable material gathered as the house was in session, but I believe that the Canadian Manufacturers Association might have something of service on this matter.

I am checking up Mr. Stork's remarks in the house during the various sessions, and generally making preparations for the election even though it may be delayed.

Any suggestions you would care to make will be greatly appreciated, or any assistance given will help very much in turning the tide of battle here. We are handicapped very much in not having a paper upon which we can rely for very much assistance.
