With reference to claims by Indians for cattle killed on the railway track, I beg to inform you that the Claims Agent offers to settle as follows, viz:-

Anson Jacobs, cow, valued \$45.00- offered \$40.00

Joseph Panajewong " " \$50.00- offered \$35.00

Joseph Jones bull, valued \$75.00- offered \$40.00

The Department's Law Clerk recommends that these reduced amounts be accepted in preference to litigation, the result of which is doubtful.

Kindly advise whether the Indians concerned are respectively willing to accept the offers.
