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to be attributed to nerves. The M.O. there gave the accused to understand, upon being discharged, that he was to be re-boarded. Upon arriving at his reinforcement Bn he endeavoured to see the M.O. and upon doing this was advised that he was probably alright to go to the field again. This man's record shows only a few minor offences which the Court will appreciate. Although the accused is only 19 he is the eldest son and the only other member of his family is his father who was with the Veterans' Guard of Canada. That the accused is guilty of the offences as charged we do not deny but on the other hand a deliberation on the foregoing facts deserve every consideration. I recommend that if the Court can possibly have this man examined by a psychiatrist they will assist materially in insuring that he may not again have to appear before another Court-Martial for similar or worse offences.
