

5. The Council shall have power to make bylaws and the bylaws so made by the Council shall come into force as soon as they are approved by the Indian Department.
6. The Council may meet at any time at the call of the Chief Councillor. In the absence of the Chief Councillor the Assistant Chief Councillor shall then take his place. Four members of the Council shall be a quorum.
7. No person other than a Councillor, Indian Agent, Missionary, or Interpreter, shall speak at Council meetings unless permitted to do so by the presiding officer. None but a Councillor shall vote.
8. Any owner or occupier of any house on the Reserve refusing to clear up the house or yard, or refusing to destroy putrid or filthy matter about the dwelling when requested to do so by the Chief Councillor of the Council, may be fined \$20. and the cost of having the work done by others.
9. Any person who persists in obstructing the order or business of a Council Meeting, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding \$5.
10. Any person guilty of disorderly conduct shall be liable to a fine commensurate with the offence but not to exceed \$30.00 and costs.
- II. Any person found guilty of entering any house with intent to commit a felony, shall be liable to a fine to be imposed by the Council according to the gravity of the offence, but not to exceed \$30.00 and costs.
12. Any person guilty of desecrating the Lord's Day shall be warned by the Council; a second offence shall render him liable to a fine of \$5. and costs.
