## CROWN LANDS AGENCY OF ABITIBI

The purchase price of a lot is three cents an acre, and the conditions of sale as follows:

1.—The purchaser shall clear at least three acres each year, and have them under cultivation the following year.

2.—Within thirty months from the date of sale, the purchaser shall build a house and a barn, and commence residing as required by clause 3 in order, to obtain Letters-Patent.

3.—The purchaser may obtain his Letters-Patent after thirty months of continuous residence on his lot, if there is on such lot fifteen acres per cent under cultivation.

Every location ticket holder residing with his relatives (his father or mother) on a lot situated in the same township as his own, is relieved from the obligation of building on his own lot and residing thereon, provided the required area on each lot is under cultivation.

N. B.—An absence of more than six months without the permission of the Crown lands' agent constitutes an interruption of residence.

4.—No timber shall be cut before the issuing of the Letters-Patent except for clearing, fuel, buildings and fences, and all timber cut contrary to this condition shall be considered as having been cut without permission on public land.

5.—As an encouragement, the holder of the present location ticket will be allowed, when he shall have, during the two first years of occupation, put under cultivation at least three acres of his land, to cut for his own benefit and without cost, at a place indicated by the local agent, all the timber growing on an additional area of ten acres taken in one block, over and above the area which he is obliged to put under cultivation in order to obtain his Letters-Patent.

6.—All timber that a settler is allowed to cut on his lot of land before the issue of the Letters-Patent and which he intends to dispose of for commercial purposes must be manufactured in Canada, and all the provisions of article 13 of the Timber Regulations now in force apply thereto.

7.—The purchaser shall comply with the laws and regulation concerning the public Lands, Woods and Forests, Mines Fisheries in this Province.
