HAMILTON WATER WORKS.

William Harkins, Chief engineer. office City Buildings.

The Hamilton Water Works were incorporated April 20th, 1836, by act of parliament, and are erected about 250 yards from Lake Ontario. These works are sup rior to any other in the Dominion, excepting those of Montreal. Their total co t was \$800,000; and there are now (1876) upwaids of fity miles of pipe laid in the city. The machinery is complete and perfect. The power consists of two double cylinder engin s of one hundred horse power each, and the supply amounts to about 800 000 gailons a day of 11 hours The reservoir three and a half miles from the works, is 185 feet above the level of the lake. It is 25 fet deep and will contain hine millions imperial gallons The water from lake Ontario is filtered through 31 feet of and. The power required to force the water into the reservoir is equal to 51 tons to the

square foot on the main pipe which has an inside diameter of 18 inches and is only one inch thick
