The present Mayor of the City is the Hon. W. N. The City is well laid out with wide streets, Main street being the principal, on which are slready many fine and handsome brick buildings among which are the Pacific Hotel, (unfinished) the dwelling of Mr. Hespeler, immigration agent, the under part being occupied as a store and offices, the Custom house, Dominion Lands office, Hudson Bay Company's Land offices, Bertrand & Prud'homme's dry goods store, Cronn's Restaurant, the Ontario Bank, the Merchants Bank, Hon. Mr. Bannatyne's extensive grocery establishment, Ashdown's hardware store, the General Post Office and the new City Hall and Market. In the course of the present year several large buildings will be added. This fine street will in a short time be nearly equal to King Street of Toronto, or St. James street of Montreal. Toronto, or St. James street of Montreal. The import entries at the Custom House are rapidly increasing, the total value of Imports for the year ending 30th June, 1875, being \$1,243,309, on which a duty of \$171,-430,86 was collected, and then remaining in warehouse under Bond, goods to the value of \$31,822 on which was a duty of \$14,344,-47 of the imports to the value of \$782,284 were from the United States. The total exports for the same year, amounted to \$588,958. The value of lots within the City limits range from \$50 to \$3000. Among the educational establishments in the City are the Central, and the North Ward Public schools, the former attended by pupils of an intermediate grade; the latter is for primary pupils; the Wesleyan Educational Institute: the Manitoba College, under the auspices of the Presbyterian Church; the Roman Catholic Public School in the West Ward, and St. Mary's Academy in the East Ward, and St. Mary's Academy in the East Ward. There is also in St. Boniface Parish, without the City limits on the East side of the Red River, beautifully situated, St Boniface College, under the auspices of the Roman Catholic Church as accelerated. Cothege, under the auspices of the Roman Catholic Church, an excellent and popular educational institution, established for many years. St John's College is a similar institution, under the auspices of the Church of England. It is also partially leasted in the England. It is also prettily located in the parish of St. Johns just outside the City limits and has been in existence for many
