Labor Bureaus Asked at Hands of the Province

Toronto, July 22.—An interim report was issued by the Ontario Unemployment Commission yesterday. The personnel of the Commission is as follows: Chairman, Sir John Willison; Treasurer, Mr. W. P. Gundy; Archbishop Neil McNeil, D.D., Venerable Archdeacon Henry J. Cody, D.D., Rev. Daniel Strachan, D.D., Mr. W. K. McLaughlin, C.M.G., Mr. Joseph K. Gibbons, Mr. G. Frank Beer, Prof. Alfred T. DeLury, Mr. W. L. Best of Ottawa; Secretary, Mr. G. E. Jackson.

The Commission has made the following recommendations: "That a Provincial Department of Labor be created either as a separate department or in connection with an existing department of the Government."

"That the Provincial Labor Commission shall have absolute power in determining the test through which those to be appointed to positions in connection with Employment Bureaus must pass."

"That the control and inspection of private employment agencies be given to the Provincial Labor Commission."

"That the system of Employment Bureaus be managed by the Provincial Labor Commission through a director with practical knowledge and understanding of the problems connected with employment."

"That the director shall have associated with him as an assistant a woman of training and ability who will act as Secretary to the Provincial Labor Commission."

"That with each local Employment Bureau shall be associated a small Advisory Committee appointed by the Provincial Labor Commission."

"That the Employment Bureaus, in all cases of strikes or lockouts, remain neutral."

SIR SANDFORD FLEMING HAS PASSED AWAY

Eminent Engineer, Born in Scotland, Died This Morning.

By Special Wire to the Courier. Halifax, July 22.—Sir Sandford Fleming, engineer, scientist, and public man, died here this morning after a short illness at the age of 88.

Sandford Fleming was born in Kirkcaldy, Fifeshire, Scotland, on January 7, 1827. He was educated there and came to Canada in 1845. He joined the engineering staff of the Northern Railway, Toronto, subsequently becoming chief engineer.

He practised engineering in Ontario and was elected a member of the institute of civil engineers, London, and of the American Society of Engineers and elected as honorary member of the Canadian Society of Civil Engineers.

In recognition of his public services Queen Victoria made him a companion of the Order of St. Michael and St. George in 1877 and a Knight Commander in 1897.

FREE USE OF MAIL

"That, if possible, privileges be secured from the Dominion Government to enable workers living at a distance from the Bureau to mail applications for employment free of charge to the nearest Bureau."

"The Commission also recommends that all primary schools be requested to provide for domestic, manual or agricultural instruction, and that the age for leaving school be raised to fifteen years."

"Regarding insurance against unemployment, it is recommended that financial assistance be given by the Government of Ontario to those voluntary associations of workmen which undertake to provide unemployment benefits for their members, and that the assistance to such associations equal to per cent of the sum disbursed by them in unemployment benefits."

IMPORT DUTY FREE

Paris, July 22.—The purchase for the French Army of 120,000 tons of refrigerated meat annually until the end of the war, or until December 31, 1916, has been agreed upon by Minister of Agriculture David and Eugene Maulever, head of the army administration. Companies doing business with the government will be permitted to import their products, duty free.

FOUR ANARCHISTS CHARGED

Paris, July 22.—The first day of the trial before the permanent court-martial of four anarchists, charged with the circulation of seditious matter was devoted to an examination of the accused explicitly with furnishing postage for mailing seditious matter and with taking an active part in an anarchist propaganda. Mme. Donnadier is accused of posting the letters. The three seditious pamphlets which figure in the case are said to have been written by the defendant Bureau, who admitted intimacy with anarchist leaders, but denied the specific charge preferred against him.

843,000 MARRIED MEN IN BRITISH FORCES. London, July 22.—Speaking for the Government in the House of Lords yesterday, Lord Newton said that at present in the British army was approximately 843,000. The aggregate cost of separation allowances paid to wives and children of these men has been £25,000,000 (\$25,000,000).
