How large a total is necessary to make the loan a success is a question to which no definite answer is available. The **FROM GERMANY** national accounts indicate £506,-000,000 new money is needed to insure a clean slate for the govern-ment on entering the next financial year on April 1. The government ex-pects to obtain not only this amount but enough more to carry it a con-siderable distance through the new financial year.


