Of course, as was mentioned, the raising the price will lessen the consumption. but then when monopolists can make as much money in three months as they can in six months, they have concluded can in six months, they have conciled to do so. This is one of the beautiful features of high protective duties; the consumer pays the monopolist to stand idle for half the time, and the workmen obtain employment for only half the time they would under an ordinary revenue tariff.
