DEATH OF WILL TOMPKINS AT EAST FLORENCEVILLE

On July 12 East Florenceville lost one of its oldest and most respected residents in the death of William Tompkins. Mr. Tompkins, who was predeceased by his wife, Sarah, nine years ago, was born April 15, 1846, in East Florenceville, where he resided all his life. He was married in Woodstock by Rev. Mr. McKee, father of Judge McKee, who was a witness at the marriage. He joined the Baptist church at East Florenceville about forty-five years ago and was deacon for a number of years. He also taught the Young Men's Bible class for about thirty years and was always a very active and faithful member of the church to which he belonged.

Mr. Tompkins represented the Parish of Peel at the Municipal Council for twenty-five years and was presented with a gold headed cane in token of appreciation of his valuable services in this respect. He was a liberal in politics until the Riel rebellion, which, together with the railway and land policy of Sir J. A. McDonald, had the effect of changing his political views and he was always a staunch supporter of the conservative party afterward. He was always found very active in anything pertaining to the welfare of the community in which he lived and to know Mr. Tompkins was to like and respect him. He leaves to mourn, one son, Frank L., and three daughters, Mrs. W. W. Melville, Mrs. L. A. Simonson and Mrs. J. A. McIsaac, all of East Florenceville. Rev. E. B. McLatchey, B. A., B. D., of Moncton, conducted the funeral service.

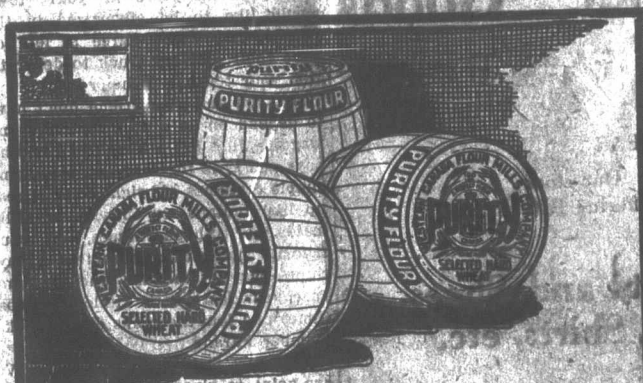

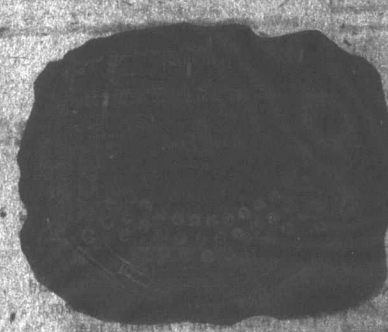
