OBITUARY.

W. H. Parker, eldest son of the late Robt. Parker was born in Bucknole, N. B., on April 17th, 1831. He moved to Campbellton when very young, where he spent the greater part of his life. At one time he was one of the most prosperous drygoods merchants of this town. In 1874 he married Eliza daughter of the late David Nelson of Kempt Road, Quebec. The same year he moved to Round Hill N. S., where he kept a large fruit farm. In 1885 he returned to Campbellton and bought out the firm known as Parker & Andrew. In 1889 he again returned to N. S. and resided in Digby. Here he conducted a drygoods business and was at the head of the company known as the Digby Coal Co. In 1897 Mr Parker returned to Campbellton where he resided until his death. Three sons, Robt. of Bismarck, Arizona, Harry at home and John of Moncton and one daughter at home, also three sisters, Miss Tom Andrew of Vancouver, B. C., Mrs. John Conally and Mrs. Hugh Miller and one brother, Richard of this town are left to the loss of a loving father. The funeral service was held from his late residence, conducted by Rev. W. Thomson assisted by Dr. Carr.

Friday afternoon May 17th files past peacefully to rest. Her death though not unexpected, came as a severe shock to her relatives and friends. Always bright and cheerful even up to the time when she was summoned to the mysterious beyond the deceased had endeavored to path old and young of all classes. Mrs. Miles had been the leader of the Baptist choir for a number of years and hereafter as well as in Church generally she will be greatly missed. One son, George survives and we extend our most sincere sympathy.

Funeral took place on Sunday. Rev. P. J. Stocking the service at the very touching and beautiful and useful life.

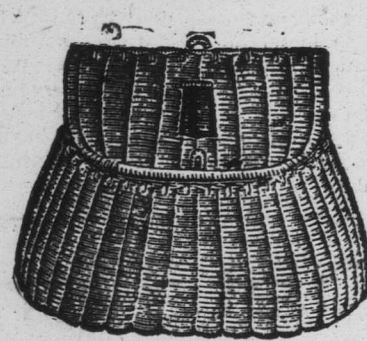
