### The Corinthian Arrives

The s.s. Corinthian, Capt. A. Rennie, arrived here yesterday after a passage of 9 days from Liverpool, during which she had very stormy weather. She left Liverpool Tuesday week, and from the time she left the Mersey had a succession of gales from the W. & N.W. with a heavy sea, which continued until port was reached. Tuesday past the ship encountered dense fog and she ran at slow speed, though that night it cleared, and she was enabled to run at normal speed. Several icebergs, some of them of large size, were sighted Wednesday. The ship brought 730 tons cargo, 14 bags and 6 baskets of mail and the following passengers for this port: W. B. Grieve, J. J. Oxley, Jno. Patten, Mr. Robinson, Mrs. Ryhards, child and nurse, Jno. Watson, Mr. and Mrs. G. M. Barr, 2 intermediate and 16 steerage. The ship has 7 saloon passengers in transit to Halifax and 852 steerage, most of whom are bound from the United Kingdom to the Canadian North West. This is the first time the ship has visited this port. She is a fine vessel of 6,227 tons gross, 4,018 nett, and was built at Belfast in 1900. Last night many citizens, went to Shea & Co's premises to view the ship.
